## **Age of Self**

**Intro:** Two sermons in one: summary of week; optimistic outlook.

## 1. The Age of Self

- A. Society has made us less dependent upon community to survive. We have the means to indulge ourselves, focus on selves, please selves.
  - 1. To what degree shall I concentrate on, serve myself? To point of hurting others? Defying authority (parents, school)? Disobeying God?
  - 2. James/John demonstrate "me first" attitude: Mt 20:20ff. "We are able."
  - 3. "The rules don't apply to me" mentality. Lack of team/community attitudes in local churches. **Illus:** Exceptions Bible class age categorization.

## B. Examples of selflessness:

- 1. Jesus modeled: "Though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor" (2 Cor 8:9); equality with God not held at all costs (Ph 2:5-11). Objection: But God restored Him to former position. Yes, but doesn't He promise same to us? Temporary self-denial for eternal weight of glory?
- 2. Paul: Sacrificed Jewish "career track," ties, income, comfort, etc. for ridicule, beatings, imprisonment, shipwreck, slander, abandonment by brethren, etc. "Servant to all ... all things to all men" (1 Cor 9:19ff); "not seeking my own profit" (10:33).
- 3. We admire such in Jesus/Paul, but who has the courage, initiative to adopt such a philosophy for him/herself?
- C. Jesus boldly and directly challenges us: "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, take up his cross, and follow Me" (Mt 16:24). Purely selfish pursuits are hollow and vain; they do not bring happiness.

## 2. The Battle Is Won!

- A. Lessons have warned about threats, evil influences around us. We are fighting a spiritual war that has eternal implications.
  - 1. "Fight the good fight of faith" (1 Tim 6:12).
  - 2. "You must endure hardship as a good soldier of Jesus Christ" (2 Tim 2:3-4).

- 3. Armor/weapons issued: Eph 6:10-18; 2 Cor 10:4-5.
- B. The outcome of the battle has been decided Jesus and His army wins! **Illus:** We may not want to know the outcome of the game; suspense. But when our eternal welfare is at stake, we want assurance!
  - 1. "But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord" (1 Cor 15:57).
  - 2. "And this is the victory that has overcome the world our faith" (1 Jn 5:4).
  - 3. "In all these things we are more than conquerors ..." (Rom 8:35-37).
- C. We have a decision to make, a decision for the ages:

**Not:** Do I want to be in this war? *In it already*.

**But:** Whose side am I on?

**Conclusion:** Ph 2:14-15 – We must be "children of God without fault in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom you shine as lights in the world."

- 1. The hope for the future is not in religious gimmickry, smarmy emotionalism, unwarranted personal attacks or any other carnal approaches.
- 2. The hope lies in men and women of genuine faith, thorough knowledge of God's word, undivided loyalty to the Lord who died for them.
- 3. Such will make for strong congregations which will produce fruitful teachers, sound evangelists and conscientious, wise elders.
