Today's Homemaker: Honor or Humiliation?

1. The Modern Concept of a Housewife

- A. Which interests you?
 - 1. Change dirty diapers, wipe runny noses, make up beds, do endless loads of laundry, vacuum, dust, mop the floor, clean toilets, drive in the car-pool, shop for groceries, cook, spend the day with no adult conversation, hear "Mommy" 40,000 times per day, clean up spilled Kool-aid, be a slave to your husband and servant to your children. **Any takers?**
 - 2. Career as nurse, chef, tailor, fashion designer, realtor, interior designer, land-scaper, counsellor, personnel manager, purchasing agent, teacher, financial manager/accountant, volunteer in humanitarian cause, day-care worker, chauffeur. **Any takers?**
 - 3. These are actually different descriptions of the **same job.** Read Pr 31:10-31.
- B. Clash between "conventional wisdom" and God's word:
 - 1. Conventional wisdom: Being a homemaker is demeaning, unchallenging, unfulfilling wasted existence. True self-worth is found by competing with men, emotional and financial independence, seeing first to your own needs. "This wisdom does not descend from above, but is earthly, sensual, demonic" (Jas 3:15).
 - 2. Divine wisdom: Being a wife/mother brings honor, challenge, and the clearest and richest fulfillment to be found by a female in earthly life.
 - 3. The home is the most important institution of society, and the woman is to "manage" the home 1 Tim 5:14. This is *oikodespotes*, ruler or master of the house.
- C. A challenge of faith, obedience: Do we *truly* believe and respect what God says about the role of the woman in society, family and the church?

2. What a Family Needs from a Woman

- A. A diligent, industrious woman who is wholly devoted to the welfare and progress of her family Pr 18:22; 19:14, but see 12:4. She can **make** or **break** family.
 - 1. Running a household is a **big** job; it takes a woman of strength: Pr 31:13-15, 17, 21-22, 27.
 - 2. She is financially responsible: Pr 31:11, 16, 19, 24.

- B. She is a woman of godly character: Pr 31:12, 20, 25-26 (compassion, honor, wisdom, kindness). She has spiritual strength Pr 31:30.
- C. A woman who is supportive of and submissive to her husband Pr 31:11, 23, 31 (implied).
 - 1. Nowhere in Scripture is "submission" equated with inferiority, incapability or abject servitude. There **is**, however, a hierarchy of authority; the man is the ultimate head of the wife and family which is to be exercised for their good.
 - 2. Sarah, the example of humble submission 1 Pet 3:5-6; Gn 21:10-12. Women are not brainless idiots deserving of no consultation or consideration.
 - 3. For women, this is a **blessing,** not a curse. It is a tremendous strain to carry the full weight of responsibility for the material, spiritual and emotional well-being of the family.

3. What a Woman Needs from Her Family

- A. **Praise** Pr 31:28-29. Anyone who invests their whole life in the care, development and happiness of others deserves the highest praise and adoration.
- B. Husbands/children Do you take your wife for granted? "Her worth is far above rubies" (Pr 31:10). A **good** wife is rare.
- C. Wives/mothers Are you content to fulfill your God-given role in life? Do you chafe and murmur at your lot? Do you look wistfully at a "career" and lament the better life that is slipping away?
